A Letter from the Library Director

I've always believed that the strength of our organization lies in how we collaborate. I am continually inspired by how our community's institutions work together to create extraordinary value for every resident. RHPL's collaboration with Dinosaur Hill Nature Preserve is a prime example of efficient governance. This partnership helps RHPL bring delightful programs to the library while Dinosaur Hill manages a native seed library that benefits our entire community, preventing an unnecessary duplication of services. Our mini-branch at OPC provides convenient access to library materials, and in turn, the OPC hosts specialized dementia-related programs for residents. These alliances allow each organization to shine in its area of expertise and deliver more complete services to you. And these are just a few examples of many partnerships that RHPL maintains. We encourage you to attend our non-profit fair on June 14th and learn more about other community organizations with which the library regularly partners.

The Michigan eLibrary (MeL) is a prime example of efficiency and resource-sharing. Perhaps our most comprehensive strategic partnership, RHPL patrons ensure we are one of the most active libraries in the system by taking full advantage of MeLCat interlibrary loans and essential MeL databases. Unfortunately, the fate of this service is in jeopardy and needs our support for continued funding beyond October 1, 2025. The withdrawal of federal funds has created uncertainty for library services statewide, but it also presents an opportunity for our community to champion a service that delivers tremendous value.

Rochester Hills residents wisely approved additional funding for the library in 2024, which provides RHPL with greater stability and more opportunities for growth than many other libraries, but our mission extends beyond our city limits. As stated in our board-approved principles, RHPL actively "seeks partnerships to advance our values." By advocating for MeL's continuation, we not only work to preserve these services for ourselves but also to support smaller communities across Michigan, reinforcing our reputation as a leader in the state.

I'm grateful to serve a community that understands the power of working together. I share this information so you can be informed and advocate for the library services that enrich our community. Our library's collaborative approach embodies the very essence of efficient public service, a standard to which all institutions should aspire. Together, we will continue building a resilient community through strategic partnerships and shared resources.

The Parent Child Workshop is a fiveweek program for toddlers and

their parents or caregivers.

Held in the fall and spring, it is an informal, play-based program with developmentally appropriate toys, books, and movement and art activities.

Each session in the Parent Child Workshop covers a different theme,

such as child development, speech, language and hearing, and the role music and movement play in child development. During the workshop, parents can talk with community resource professionals for more information or to address concerns about their child's development. And equally important, families can spend time together and make new friends in a relaxed and welcoming space.

In addition to the Parent Child Workshop, the Youth Services department has a variety of materials and activities available for children. Offering much more than books for all stages of development, families can check out audiobooks and audio-enabled books, magazines, movies, story kits, play and STEAM kits, puppets, and bilingual and language

learning materials. The Parent Teacher

Collection has books about infant and child development, education, health, socialemotional learning, and other essential information. Collections are thoughtfully arranged near a large play area featuring toys that encourage imaginative and social play.

Community outreach is another key component of Family Place Library services. RHPL's community bookmobile, Books On Board (BoB), travels throughout Rochester, Rochester Hills, and Oakland Township five days a week. The bookmobile brings library materials directly to patrons with limited transportation, abilities, and travel time. Families can check out items from the mobile collection or send main library holds for pickup, and enjoy outdoor storytimes

at select BoB stops during the summer.

Patrons at lobby stops in senior living communities can check out books to read with their favorite young visitors.

Community outreach for our youngest patrons comes from the Big Blue Bus. This beloved early literacy program visits preschools and

childcare centers to bring storytimes and a mobile book collection to children ages birth to five. During bi-weekly school visits, children have fun while developing language and pre-reading skills by moving along with music, reading, talking, and playing with RHPL's Early Literacy Librarian. They get to choose their own books from a specialized collection, which is crucial in fostering interest and joy in reading, and teachers have an opportunity to select books for their classrooms. The Big Blue Bus builds strong relationships with early childhood centers, delivers information about RHPL's services, and introduces children to the library, many of whom may be unable to visit with their families during busy work weeks.

Far from being an honorary designation, Family Place Libraries work with their community to assemble resources in one friendly place, making it easier for families to raise readers, play,

and spend quality time with each other. If you haven't visited us yet, this summer is a great time to bring your family together at RHPL.






